Target Audience/Prerequisites

This course is intended for the registered nurse (RN), licensed practical/vocational nurse (LPN/LVN) with more than one year of TB experience and greater than 50% of job duties dedicated to TB including case identification, case management, and treatment of patients with TB infection or disease. Participants should be familiar with the principles of TB nurse case management and will be asked to complete a worksheet on available social services in their area prior to attending the program.

Program Description

This activity will illustrate key concepts in TB prevention and care, and provide TB nurses with an opportunity to actively engage with 'real world' issues, learn strategies and develop knowledge and skills to address the challenges of managing patients with TB. Using a case-based approach, the session will present the elements of patient-centered care, describe its role in TB case management, and explore approaches for using patient-centered care to ensure successful outcomes.

Conference Objectives

Upon course completion, participants will be able to: define patient-centered care; discuss the role of patient-centered care in TB care and prevention; discuss challenges and approaches in managing and monitoring patients with TB; apply the principles of patient-centered care as it relates to nurse case management of individuals with TB; and identify approaches for multidisciplinary collaboration with partners.
